





Project aims

Mission:

To collect all external quality assurance reports and decisions performed by EQAR-registered agencies in line with the ESG in order to make these available to various user groups.

Objectives:

- Improve access to information on the external quality assurance of higher education
- 2) Facilitate the recognition of qualifications
- 3) Map the diversity of external quality assurance frameworks in Europe
- 4) Facilitate the exchange of data and links with other tools
- 5) Pilot the use of the database as a basis for Europe-wide thematic studies

Design principles

Structure:

- Lean approach: only what is needed and readily available
- Standardised but reflecting varied structure of external QA: institutional level as starting point, programmes not feasible for all


Scope:

- Comprehensive and up-to-date: includes all currently valid reports/reviews within the scope of the ESG
- Accessible and understandable: use of English; contextual information provided to clarify the status of reports and activities

Access:

- Low entry barrier for agencies: possible for all EQAR-registered agencies to feed information into the database; all methods/code made public
- Free and open access to public: no fees or restrictions on use; data also available as "open data" through data dump or public search API







Data submission

Manual Entry on Web Form:


- Agencies without IT developers and/or with a closed system architecture
- Submit small amounts of data occasionally

CSV File Upload (comma-separated values):

- Agencies with or without IT developers and which can export data from agency system
- Work manually on the dataset before submission
- Submit big amount of data in a batch

API (application programming interface):

- Agencies with IT developers and which can create link directly to local system to keep in sync with DEQAR
- Send data automatically in JSON format
- Suitable for large amounts of data



State of play

- Public preview launched on 23 May 2018
- Key figures as of **23 May 2019**:
 - 9737 reports covering 1624 HEIs in 56 countries
 - 50% of the content expected by October 2019
 - Approximately 100 unique page views/day, accounting for ca. 35% of EQAR site traffic





Poland has been a Governmental Member of EQAR since February 2008.

Higher education is offered by university-type (uczelnia akademicka) and non-university-type (uczelnia zawodowa) institutions.

University-type higher education institutions can offer third-cycle degrees, while non-university type may only offer first- and second-cycle degrees.

Institutional evaluation was carried out in Poland between 2012-2016. Following the amendments to the Law on Higher Educatiom, institutional evaluations were suspended and changes were made to the programme evaluation criteria for general academic and practice-oriented profile.

Programmes evaluations

may result in an outstanding assessment (awarded for 8 years), a positive assessment (6 years), a conditional assessment (a date of follow-up assessment will be given) and a negative assessment.

National External Quality Assurance Requirements

- Institutional accreditation
 - Once in every seven years higher education institutions must undergo institutional accreditation.
- Quality assessment of study programme groups

Obligatory periodic assessment (every seven years) of all the study programme groups in which a higher education institution has been granted the right to conduct studies.


Initial assessment of study programme groups

An educational institution is granted the right to conduct studies by the Government of the Republic of Estonia in a specific study programme group and in a specific academic cycle (professional higher education, bachelor degree studies, master degree studies, doctoral studies). This allows the HEI to issue state-recognised diplomas under all programmes contained in the corresponding study programme group. Before such right is granted, the study programme group must undergo initial assessment, which the Ministry of Education commissions from EKKA.




